Nurture and Knowledge Hand in Hand

HOW CAN YOU STOP CORONAVIRUSES SPREADING?

If you need to cough or sneeze

- **Catch it** with a tissue.
- **Bin it**
- **Kill it** by washing your hands with soap and water (see NHS guidance below) for **20 seconds** or use hand sanitiser.

You should wash your hands with soap and water or hand sanitiser:-

- After breaks and sport activities.
- Before cooking and eating.
- On arrival at any childcare or educational setting.
- After using the toilet
- Before leaving home.

ALSO

Try not to touch your eyes, nose and mouth with unwashed hands.

Do NOT share items that come into contact with your mouth such as cups and bottles.

If unwell, do not share items such as bedding, dishes, pencils and towels.

PLEASE reiterate with your child the importance of handwashing and following the guidance above and below.
